Intermediate Symbolic Logic

Lecture: 216 Wellman, MWF 1:10-2:00

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Topic: The course covers first-order predicate logic at a basic level. Students will learn the symbolism of predicate logic, natural-language and formal interpretations of predicate logic, and derivations in predicate logic.

Final Examination: Wednesday, March 21, 1:00-3:00 P.M.

Grades will be based on two midterms (30% each) and a final examination (40%). The final will be comprehensive, with most of its content being drawn from material in the final segment of the course. All examinations must be taken at the time scheduled, unless prior permission to change the time is given by the instructor. All work must be completed for the course to be passed. Incompletes will be given only if the instructor is consulted before the final examination.
